

# Hurricane Preparedness

## A Condensed Guide to Preparing Your Family

### BEFORE THE STORM



Check your insurance coverage on storms, flooding and wind damage. Inventory your property and take photos of storm preps.



Know your evacuation plan. Consider things like sheltering on a lower level, if in a high-rise, and safe places to park your vehicle.



Prepare your emergency kit. You should have things like water, medicine, cash and other items to last for each person and pet in your group for **3 to 7 days**.



Make sure your yard, trees and shrubs are well maintained and pruned before hurricane season. Bring any potted plants or outdoor furniture inside.

### DURING THE STORM



Follow all warnings and directions from first responders.



If sheltering in place, go to an interior room away from windows.

### AFTER THE STORM



Avoid downed power lines and standing water.



Take photos and video of any storm damage.

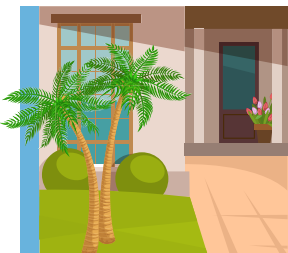
### Please follow these tips:



Ensure that hurricane shutters are in good working order and are being maintained regularly. If your property has hurricane panels, make sure all required hardware and materials are easily available and accessible.



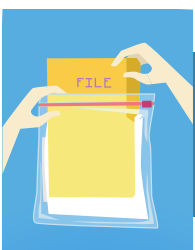
NBV maintains storm water drains on public property. Drains on private multifamily communities must be maintained property owners/management. Ensure private storm drains are serviced/cleaned to alleviate standing water in roads and parking lots.



Trim your trees to avoid having dead branches and pruned landscaping from becoming dangerous objects during a windstorm. Proper disposal of these items are critical to avoid property damage in a storm.



Review your property emergency plans, kits, and emergency equipment such as generators, pumps, and critical building equipment.



Emergency plans should include an inventory of all loose/unsecure items on the property that should be removed before a weather event. All heavier outside storage materials, construction equipment, etc. should be properly secured, as well.
