Hurricane Preparedness





North Bay Village is in the potential path of hurricanes, and we face a unique threat as we are surrounded by Biscayne Bay. Now is the time to review your emergency plans, and begin to perform essential property maintenance sooner rather than later. With public safety as the Village's utmost priority, all City departments are working diligently to provide the support you need to keep you, your family and your business safe during a state of emergency.

Please follow these tips:



Ensure that hurricane shutters are in good working order and are being maintained regularly. If your property has hurricane panels, make sure all required hardware and materials are easily available and accessible.



NBV maintains storm water drains on public property. Drains on private multifamily communities must be maintained property owners/management. Ensure private storm drains are serviced/cleaned to alleviate standing water in roads and parking lots.



Trim your trees to avoid having dead branches and pruned landscaping from becoming dangerous objects during a windstorm. Proper disposal of these items are critical to avoid property damage in a storm.



Review your property emergency plans, kits, and emergency equipment such as generators, pumps, and critical building equipment.



Emergency plans should include an inventory of all loose/unsecure items on the property that should be removed before a weather event. All heavier outside storage materials, construction equipment, etc. should be properly secured, as well.
