Subject: Budget Amendment for the Harbor Island Beautification Project

Harbor Island Beautification involves removing and replacing ground cover in 34 bulb-outs on East and West Drive. The contractor will excavate the soil from each bulb-out and replace it with planting soil and mulch. Then they will plant Green Island Ficus as ground cover consistently throughout the Island. SFM Services Inc will perform the tasks.

The project went to the village commission on April 12, 2022, to approve a resolution to fund the project for \$51,805.80. This was a new Capital Project (CP22-05), as it was not a part of the Adopted Budget/5- Year Capital Plan. Staff recommended that the Commission authorize the Transfer from the General Fund of the Appropriation of Unreserved Fund Balance (001.00.389.3891) of \$41,805.80 and Repair & Maintenance of Grounds (112.18.541.4605) of \$10,000, to the Capital Projects Fund for the Landscape Improvements Harbor Island Project (320.61.630.6100) for a total of \$51,805.80.

During discussions on the item, the commissioners agreed to modify the project's scope; only ground cover planting in the Harbor Island bulb-outs was to be carried out. They further recommended not to use the General Fund of the Appropriation of Unreserved Fund Balance to fund the project: A portion of the PW department's budgeted line items would pay for it.

We received an updated proposal from SFM for \$17,657.50 to complete the required beautification. Staff now recommends that \$10,000 be drawn from Repair & maintenance of Grounds (GL-112.18.541.4605) and the remaining \$7,657.50 from Temporary Personnel (GL-112.18.541.6320).
