

35 The Village Clerk shall determine the required format for the Campaign
36 Treasurer's Reports. For purposes of this section, "Campaign Treasurer's
37 Reports" shall mean the reports required of the campaign treasurers of
38 candidates pursuant to Section 106.07, Florida Statutes, as amended.

39 (B) Electronic Posting. Campaign Treasurer's Reports shall be posted on the
40 Village's website by the Village Clerk within three (3) business days from the
41 report due date.

42 (C) Penalties. In addition to any other penalties which may be applicable, any
43 individual who violates this section shall be subject to a fine up to fifty dollars
44 (\$50.00) per day for the first three (3) days late and, thereafter, five hundred
45 dollars (\$500.00) per day for each day late, not to exceed twenty-five (25)
46 percent of the total receipts or expenditures, whichever is greater, for the period
47 covered by the late report. If it is determined by a court which has jurisdiction
48 over an alleged violation of the ordinance from which this section derives that
49 unusual circumstances caused the Campaign Treasurer's Report to be filed
50 late, no fine shall be imposed by the court. As used herein, "unusual
51 circumstances" shall mean uncommon, rare or sudden events over which the
52 actor has no control and which directly result in the failure to act according to
53 the filing requirements. Unusual circumstances must occur within a time period
54 that would clearly prevent the person legally responsible for filing the report
55 from doing so in a timely manner.

57 **Section 3. Severability.** That the provisions of this Ordinance are declared to
58 be severable and if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall for
59 any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the
60 validity of the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Ordinance
61 but they shall remain in effect, it being the legislative intent that this Ordinance shall
62 stand notwithstanding the invalidity of any part.

63 **Section 4. Codification.** That it is the intention of the Village Commission and
64 it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a
65 part of the Village's Code of Ordinances, and that the sections of this Ordinance may be
66 renumbered or relettered to accomplish such intentions, and that the word Ordinance
67 shall be changed to Section or other appropriate word.

68 **Section 5. Conflicts.** That all ordinances or parts of ordinances, resolutions or
69 parts of resolutions, in conflict herewith, are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

70 **Section 6. Effective Date.** That this Ordinance shall become effective
71 immediately upon final adoption on second reading.
