

2024 Charter Review Board Final Report and Recommendations

Introduction

Section 10.01(A) of the Charter of North Bay Village (the "Village") mandates that the Charter be reviewed six years from November 8, 2000 and each sixth year thereafter by an advisory Charter Review Board (the "Board") appointed by the Village Commission with a minimum of five members with at least one representative from each island.

Section 10.01(A) of the Village Charter further provides that any proposed revisions to the Charter must meet the approval of the qualified electors of the Village at an election to be held at the same time as the regularly scheduled municipal Commission election immediately following each sixth year Charter review.

On November 9, 2023, the Village Commission adopted Resolution No. 2023-145, appointing seven voting and one nonvoting Commission Liaison to the Board to review the Village's Charter in preparation for the regularly scheduled municipal election occurring on Tuesday, November 5, 2024.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

The Board proposed various amendments to the Village Charter. The proposed amendments are set forth in a strikethrough and underline format of the Village Charter attached hereto as **Exhibit B**.

The Board proposes that the below questions be submitted to the Village's qualified electors at the November 5, 2024 election. The Board recognizes that the proposed amendments and questions will be considered by the Village Commission and may be subject to further revision.

1. CONSUMER PRICE INDEX COMPENSATION ADJUSTMENT

The Village Charter provides that the Mayor be compensated \$7,800 per year and that each Commissioner be compensated \$6,300 per year. It is proposed that the Charter be amended to provide that this compensation shall be increased, but not decreased, by the Consumer Price Index (CPI) annually.

2. PUBLIC NOTICE REQUIREMENTS

The Village Charter provides that certain public notices be published in a newspaper of general circulation. It is proposed that the Charter be amended to provide that notice may alternatively be provided as otherwise permitted by Florida law, including on a publicly accessible website, provided that the cost of web advertising is less than newspaper advertising and the web publication conforms in other respects to State and Village law.
