Consent Agenda

These are simple items that are all approved together with a single affirmative vote by the Commission.

- 11A. Debris Management Agreement between FDOT and NBV Village Manager Dr. Ralph Rosado (Public Works Director Marlon Lobban)
 - The Commission will vote on whether to approve an agreement with the Florida Department of Transportation in which North Bay Village will assume responsibility for cleaning up litter and debris on the East 79th Street Bridge, which connects North Bay Village to Miami Beach, for compensation of \$5,000 annually to the Village. <u>Click here</u> to view technical details of the agreement between North Bay Village and FDOT.

- 14B5. Community Contribution Fee Village Manager Dr. Ralph Rosado
 - The Commission will discuss a resolution to implement a fee schedule for developers that wish to build above a density of 70 units/acre on properties bordering Kennedy Causeway on Treasure Island. After researching the community contribution fees used in nearby municipalities, the Village Planner has recommended an initial fee of \$20,000 per additional unit increase above a density of 70 units per acre. Developers are incentivized to move quickly on their projects through discounts to their community contribution fee if they can have their site plans approved within two years from the adoption of these regulations. <u>Click here</u> to view the research and recommendation by the Village Planner.
