Highlights from the Regular Commission Meeting on
October 12, 2021



Among the Village Items:

- [Resolution](#) to approve a [variance application](#) to authorize the issuance of a license for the sale of liquor, beer, and wine, or alcoholic beverages for a business within 500 feet of a public school. (13A.) – passed

- [Resolution](#) to approve an agreement with C.A.P. Government, Inc. for building department services for an initial three-year term with the option to renew for up to three one-year terms. (14B1.) – passed

- [Resolution](#) opposing Florida House Bill 167, also known as the "Florida Heartbeat Act," which threatens an individual's fundamental right to privacy and the right to safe and legal access to abortion. (14B3.) – passed

- [Discussion](#) to approve the new bulk waste [schedule](#) and policy based on approved revisions to Chapter 94, "Garbage, Trash, and Weeds," of the Village ordinance. (14B4.)

- The Village has reduced the frequency of service to residential properties to one day per week instead of three days per week and requires scheduled/appointment pickup for commercial and multifamily properties. This bulk policy change is estimated to have an annual saving of Village funds to be \$30,000 in staffing costs and approximately \$100,000 in tipping and disposal costs.
