<u>Title of Proposed Ordinance:</u>		
<p>AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COMMISSION OF NORTH BAY VILLAGE, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 150, "BOATS, VESSELS, AND HOUSEBOATS," OF THE VILLAGE CODE OF ORDINANCES, BY CREATING SECTION 150.22, "OVERNIGHT ANCHORING RESTRICTIONS," TO REGULATE CERTAIN OVERNIGHT ANCHORING OF VESSELS WITHIN THE WATERS OF THE VILLAGE; AMENDING SECTION 153.04, "SCHEDULE OF FINES AND CIVIL PENALTIES," TO ESTABLISH A PENALTY FOR VIOLATIONS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.</p>

<u>Summary of Proposed Ordinance and Statement of Public Purpose to be Served:</u>		
<p>The proposed ordinance amends Chapter 150 of the Village Code by creating Section 150.22 to regulate long-term overnight anchoring of vessels within the waters of North Bay Village. The ordinance is authorized by Section 327.60(2)(f), Florida Statutes, which allows local governments located within counties with populations greater than 1.5 million, including those within Miami-Dade County, to regulate certain overnight anchoring of vessels. The new section prohibits vessels from anchoring within the waters of the Village for more than thirty (30) days in any six (6) month period between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise and establishes a warning notice procedure prior to enforcement. The ordinance also amends Section 153.04 of the Village Code to add a civil penalty for violations of the new anchoring restrictions. The purpose of the ordinance is to address long-term anchoring within the Village's waters and protect navigational safety and environmental conditions in surrounding waterways, including Biscayne Bay.</p>
