since I was born," Gelber said. "Our city, our home is facing unbelievable challenges right now. Rising waters are threatening our homes, unbelievable congestion, and development that seems to be out of control. So I'm running because it's not in my DNA to sit on the sidelines."

He looked at his 97-year-old father, a retired jurist, as he said that. "I know that Dan is going to be a great candidate and, I hope, a great mayor," Seymour Gelber said, adding he is proud of his son. Dan Gelber, 56, spent nearly a decade as a federal prosecutor and a decade in the Florida Legislature before running for Florida attorney general in 2010. He lost to Pam Bondi.

He founded Gelber-Schachter & Greenberg, a law firm based in Brickell. On Tuesday, he said friends had talked to him about running before every mayoral election for years. "When this seat came open, it occurred to me that this would be the right time to do it," he said. "My fan-



ily's behind me. My friends are behind me. My dad thought that it was a good idea, too."

Gelber's only opponent at this point is Grieco, a city commissioner completing his first term. Grieco was running for a second term in that seat until incumbent Mayor Philip Levine said Jan. 12 that he would not seek a third two-year term. Grieco filed to run for mayor the next day.

"This is an open seat for the next mayor of our city, so competition is expected. I look forward to earning the voters' support by communicating my proven record of service on the commission and my vision for our future," Grieco said. "I welcome the opportunity to compare my local record as a commissioner and understanding of local Miami Beach issues with our newly filed opponent." Levine is considering a run for governor.

An appointment to the Budget Advisory Board is an appointment by the Commission, and my husband is a Commissioner. Accordingly, I contacted the Florida State Ethics Commission and spoke to Attorney Carolyn Klenke. She reviewed with me Fla. Stat. § 112.3135(2)(A), Florida's Anti-Nepotism Law. Because NBV is less than 35,000 in population, my appointment to the Budget and Audit Advisory Board is not a violation of statutes. I am not able to sit on Planning and Zoning Boards and, on Budget, I cannot participate in planning and zoning decisions. We also agreed that, although not specifically prohibited, I will not ask this year to be Chair and I will not address the Commission on behalf of the Budget and Audit Committee. I may of course address the Commission at any time in my personal capacity.
